## LEVEL CEFR A1-C2

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## GENERAL ENGLISH BEGINNER/FALSE BEGINNER

What is the level of the course?	Beginner or CEFR Level A1
What previous experience is required?	None
Who is the course for?	Basic English Course for people whose first language is not English. (English for Beginners) is for students who cannot read, write or speak any English.
What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?	<p><b>Speaking and Listening:</b> How to give personal details; name, address, phone number, nationality. How to say the alphabet, numbers and tell the time</p> <p><b>Reading and Writing:</b> You will be able to read short passages about people. You will be able to write a short description of yourself. You will know how to fill in forms.</p> <p><b>Grammar:</b> Learn the basics of grammar, e.g. the difference between a Verb, Noun, Adjective, Adverb and basic tenses.</p>
What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work. All students are required to purchase a course book. Teachers also provide handouts and worksheets. Access to other teaching media.
How will we assess your progress on the course?	Weekly reviews, revision weeks, end of semester and on demand tests and tutorials.
What type of qualification will passing this course give me?	You have a choice of several options. All students who successfully complete our courses receive a Leeds Language College Certificate. You can also optionally register for the following examinations – Trinity GESE, SEW, ISE - The TOEIC Examination or the BULATS examination. ## GENERAL ENGLISH ELEMENTARY

What is the level of the course?	Elementary or CEFR Level A2
What previous experience is required?	Elementary English is for students who can read short words, write some English e.g. name and address, understand simple sentences and give short answers
Who is the course for?	Basic English Course for people whose first language is not English.
What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?	<p><b>Speaking and Listening:</b> Engage in discussion with another person in a familiar situation about familiar topics. Speak to communicate basic information, feelings and opinions on familiar topics. Listen and respond to spoken language, including simple narratives, statements, questions and single-step instructions.</p> <p><b>Reading and Writing:</b> Read and understand short texts on familiar topics. Read and obtain information from common signs and symbols. Use written words and phrases to record or present information. Write a simple sentence with a capital letter and a full stop. Spell correctly some personal key words and familiar words.</p> <p><b>Grammar:</b> Understand the structure of basic Past, Present and Future tenses.</p>
What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work. All students are required to purchase a course book. Teachers also provide handouts and worksheets. Access to other teaching media.
How will we assess your progress on the course?	Weekly reviews, revision weeks, end of semester and on demand tests and tutorials.
What type of qualification will passing this course give me?	You have a choice of several options. All students who successfully complete our courses receive a Leeds Language College Certificate. You can also optionally register for the following examinations – Trinity GESE, SEW, ISE - The TOEIC Examination, the Cambridge K.E.T or the BULATS examination. Your exam result should reflect your general progress in class.

## GENERAL ENGLISH PRE-INTERMEDIATE

What is the level of the course?	Pre-Intermediate or CEFR Level A2+
What previous experience is required?	This course is for students who can read, write and understand a few sentences; write short sentences using simple present and past tenses; ask and answer questions about a familiar topic; understand and fill in basic forms; can understand and respond to simple questions about the present and past; and can communicate some feelings and opinions on familiar topics. You should be able to hold a simple conversation in English without referring to a dictionary or needing a translator. You should complete a course at CEFR A1 Level or Elementary level before joining this group.
Who is the course for?	The course is a lower/Pre-Intermediate level course for those whose first language is not English, who wish to improve all four language skills, speaking, listening, reading and writing, and who have completed a beginner's or elementary level course.
What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?	<p><b>Speaking and Listening:</b> Speak clearly to be heard and understood in straightforward exchanges. Make requests and ask questions to obtain information in everyday contexts. Express clearly statements of fact and short accounts and descriptions.</p> <p><b>Reading:</b> Identify common sources of information. Understand the main events of narratives and instructional texts</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> Write simple texts. Spell correctly the majority of personal details and familiar common words. Write simple and compound sentences, using common conjunctions e.g. as, and, but. Record information on forms. Write simple business and personal letters. Students will be prepared for assessment in each of the above language areas.</p> <p><b>Grammar:</b> Broaden your knowledge and understanding of grammar tenses, articles and structures. You will learn the basic tenses that are used in simple conversation/writing passages.</p>
What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work. All students are required to purchase a course book. Teachers also provide handouts and worksheets. Access to other teaching media.
How will we assess your progress on the course?	Weekly reviews, revision weeks, end of semester and on demand tests and tutorials.
What type of qualification will passing this course give me?	You have a choice of several options. All students who successfully complete our courses receive a Leeds Language College Certificate. You can also optionally register for the following examinations – Trinity GESE, SEW, ISE - The TOEIC Examination, the Cambridge K.E.T or the BULATS examination. ## GENERAL ENGLISH INTERMEDIATE

What is the level of the course?	Intermediate or CEFR Level B1
What previous experience is required?	This course is for students who can read and understand a variety of short English texts; write sentences using simple present and past tenses and some ways of talking about the future; can understand and respond to simple questions about the present, past and future; and can communicate feelings and opinions on familiar topics. You should be able to hold a general conversation in English at natural speed with a native-speaker without referring to a dictionary or needing a translator. You should complete a course at CEFR A2 level before joining this course.
Who is the course for?	The course is an Intermediate level course for those whose first language is not English, who wish to improve all four language skills, speaking, listening, reading and writing, and who have completed a course at Pre-/Lower-Intermediate level.
What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?	<p><b>Speaking and Listening:</b> Listen and respond to spoken language, including information and narratives, and follow explanations and instructions. Speak to communicate information, feelings and opinions on familiar topics both formally and informally. Engage in discussion with one or more people in familiar situations.</p> <p><b>Reading:</b> Read and understand short, straightforward texts on familiar topics. Read and obtain information from everyday sources such as newspapers and books.</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> Write to communicate information and opinions in a way suitable to an intended reader in both a formal and informal context.</p> <p><b>Grammar:</b> You will learn a variety of tenses and structures that will help you to express yourself in a more sophisticated way and understand native-level English. You will also broaden your understanding of native-level speech by learning about phrasal verbs.</p>
What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work. All students are required to purchase a course book. Teachers also provide handouts and worksheets. Access to other teaching media.
How will we assess your progress on the course?	Weekly reviews, revision weeks, end of semester and on demand tests and tutorials.
What type of qualification will passing this course give me?	You have a choice of several options. All students who successfully complete our courses receive a Leeds Language College Certificate. ## GENERAL ENGLISH UPPER-INTERMEDIATE

What is the level of the course?	Upper-Intermediate or CEFR Level B2
What previous experience is required?	This course is for students who can read and understand a variety of authentic English texts; write a description, narrative or comparison using complex and compound sentences; can use present, past and future tenses and some phrasal verbs; can communicate fluently, but with some inaccuracies. You should complete a course at CEFR Level B1 before joining this course.
Who is the course for?	The course is a Higher Intermediate level course for those whose first language is not English, who wish to use all four language skills with increasing ability and confidence in a variety of situations and speak on a variety of subjects with native-speakers.
What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?	<p><b>Speaking and Listening:</b> Listen and respond to spoken language, including information and narratives, and follow explanations and instructions of varying length, adapting response as appropriate. Understand different accents and colloquialisms. Speak to communicate information, ideas and opinions, adapting speech and content to take account of the listener(s) and context. Engage in discussion with one or more people in familiar and unfamiliar situations to produce a shared understanding. Make presentations on a variety of topics. Negotiate with other people, displaying tact and politeness.</p> <p><b>Reading:</b> Read and understand straightforward texts of varying lengths on a variety of topics, accurately and independently. Read and obtain information from different sources. Understand the language of newspapers and direct/indirect language.</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> Write to communicate information and opinions clearly using length, format and style appropriate to purpose and intended reader. Write stories and compositions using figurative language. Write formal reports, summaries and letters.</p> <p><b>Grammar:</b> Introduction to a wide range of tenses and grammar structures, phrasal verbs, conditionals, modals in the past and present form, reported and direct structures, relative clause and linking devices.</p>
What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work. All students are required to purchase a course book. Teachers also provide handouts and worksheets. Access to other teaching media.
How will we assess your progress on the course?	Weekly reviews, revision weeks, end of semester and on demand tests and tutorials.
What type of qualification will passing this course give me?	You have a choice of several options. All students who successfully complete our courses receive a Leeds Language College Certificate. You can also optionally register for the following examinations – Trinity GESE, SEW, ISE - The TOEIC Examination, IELTS Up to 5.5, Cambridge P.E.T or the BULATS examination. Your exam result should reflect your general progress in class.

# GENERAL ENGLISH ADVANCED

What is the level of the course?	Advanced or CEFR Level C1
What previous experience is required?	This course is for students who can read and understand a variety of authentic English texts; write a description, narrative or comparison using complex and compound sentences; can use present, past, future tenses, conditionals and some phrasal verbs; can communicate fluently, but with some inaccuracies. You need to complete a course at CEFR B2+ before joining this group.
Who is the course for?	The course is an Advanced level course for those whose first language is not English, who wish to use all four language skills with fluency and confidence, and who wish to converse at near-equal level with native-speakers of English.
What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?	<p><b>Speaking and Listening:</b> Listen and respond to spoken language, including information and narratives, and follow explanations and instructions of varying length, adapting response as appropriate. Speak to communicate information, ideas and opinions, adapting speech and content to take account of the listener(s) and context. Engage in discussion with one or more people in familiar, unfamiliar, academic, formal, informal situations to produce a shared understanding on common and complex topics. Negotiate in formal situations and make presentations. Discuss a topic for a length of time without the teacher's input or assistance from other students. Understand native-level conversation at natural speed and practice your understanding of a variety of accents.</p> <p><b>Reading:</b> Read and understand texts of varying lengths on a variety of topics and in various styles accurately and independently. Read and obtain information from different sources including contracts, newspapers, reports, formal letters, books and encyclopaedias.</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> Write to communicate information and opinions clearly using length, format and style appropriate to purpose and intended reader. Students will have to produce written reports, compositions and descriptions that should not differ from those produced by native-speakers of English.</p> <p><b>Grammar:</b> Practice of a wide range of tenses and grammar structures, phrasal verbs, conditionals, modals in the past and present form, reported and direct structures, relative clause and linking devices, inversion and participle clauses.</p>
What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work. All students are required to purchase a course book. Teachers also provide handouts and worksheets. Access to other teaching media. Teaching and learning methods will be those appropriate to adults. Students are expected, under the guidance of their teacher, to assume a large measure of responsibility for their progress. Learning situations will include research and project work outside the classroom, either individually or with others.
How will we assess your progress on the course?	Weekly reviews, revision weeks, end of semester and on demand tests and tutorials.
What type of qualification will passing this course give me?	This course does not lead to a formal examination but all students who successfully complete the course receive a certificate of completion.
What can I do after completing this course?	Progress on to the Cambridge CAE, CPE or Advanced IELTS/EAP 6.5+ Preparatory Course.

<b>What will the course cover and what can I expect to do by the end of it?</b>	The course focuses on examination technique as required to pass all the parts of the Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English Examination. Please refer to the Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency English Handbook for a detailed description of the examination and sample examination papers.
<b>What teaching and learning methods will be used on the course?</b>	Small groups. Maximum 18. Group, pair and individual work.
